Prior to the first day of the last semester of the student's program, the student must confer with his/her academic advisor and complete the "Intent to Graduate" form, submitting it with this checklist, **plus** any petitions, waivers, etc. See the *DSPT Student Handbook* for details on all program requirements.

Program Requirements: The concurrent option in DSPT MAPh/MATh [or GTU MA] requires a total of 63 semester units, comprising 54 units of coursework + 9 units of Research & Writing Credit, with an overall GPA of at least 3.0. Each core course must have a grade of "B" (3.0) or better. No more than 27 units of the coursework may be taken at the introductory (1000) level. At least 2 courses, preferably in the area of concentration, must be taken at the advanced (4000+) level. At least one-third of the courses must be taken at DSPT. Of the 54 units of coursework, there are 18 units of core philosophy requirements (12 units of systematic philosophy; 6 units in history of philosophy), 18 units of distribution theology requirements, and 18 units of electives. Any variances require a student petition and the approval of both the academic advisor and the Academic Dean.

Elective Courses. 18 units. All these are subject to the approval of the academic advisor. Exceptions need the approval of the Academic Dean. Courses taken to fulfill the language requirement, including courses taken to prepare a student for the GTU language exam, cannot be counted as electives toward completing course requirements of degree programs. Certain advanced-level language courses designed to equip MA students for future research, however, may be counted as electives in some circumstances. Students must petition the Academic Dean for approval of such coursework as graduate electives. Each student must choose an area of concentration in theology from those listed at the DSPT website. A total of four courses must be taken in this chosen area, and may be a combination of both core requirements and electives.
