Program Requirements. 48 units total are required, with an overall GPA of at least 3.0. Each core course must have a grade of "B" (3.0) or better. In both Options, 42 units of coursework + 6 units of Research & Writing are required. No more than 24 units of the coursework may be taken at the introductory (1000) level. At least two courses, preferably in the area of concentration, must be taken at the advanced (4000+) level.

Elective Courses. Thesis Option: 24 units (8 courses); **Exam Option:** 12 units (4 courses). In consultation with their advisor, students may choose electives outside the philosophy (PH) area – normally, not more than two courses (6 units). All these are subject to the approval of the academic advisor. Exceptions need the approval of the Academic Dean. Courses taken to fulfill the language requirement, including courses taken to prepare a student for the GTU language exam, cannot be counted as electives toward completing course requirements of degree programs. Certain advanced-level language courses designed to equip MA students for future research, however, may be counted as electives in some circumstances. Students must petition the Academic Dean for approval of such coursework as graduate electives.
