Program Requirements: 48 units total are required, with an overall GPA of at least 3.0. Each core course must have a grade of "B" (3.0) or better. The Thesis Option requires 42 units of coursework + 6 units of Research & Writing Credit; the Exam Option requires 45 units of coursework + 3 units of Research & Writing Credit. No more than 24 units of the coursework may be taken at the introductory (1000) level. At least 2 courses, preferably in the area of concentration, must be taken at the advanced (4000+) level. At least one-third of the courses must be taken at DSPT. An area of concentration must be chosen from those listed at the DSPT website, taking four courses in this area (any combination of core requirements & electives). In some cases, the area of concentration requires specific courses as specified in the *Student Handbook*. Variances require the approval of the academic advisor and the Academic Dean.
