Preparatory Coursework: The MDiv program presupposes a basic foundation in philosophy. All MDiv students are encouraged to take the first six courses (18 units). Student friars of the Western Dominican Province (WDP) must take those courses, plus the additional four courses (for a total of 30 units) to fulfill requirements for the Province's *Ratio Studiorum Particularis*. Any alternate courses require the approval of the academic advisor and the Academic Dean.

Complementary Curriculum. 15 units. In **addition** to the requirements for the MDiv degree program, the complementary curriculum allows clerical students to complete the four years of theological study canonically required for ordination in the Roman Catholic Church as outlined in the Program of Priestly Formation (PPF) and the formation documents of the Western Dominican Province. Students take these additional 15 units of coursework as follows: 3 units in Sacred Scripture, 9 units in systematic theology, and a 3 unit preaching course. The Scripture course entered below* must be whichever of the six Intermediate MDiv Scripture courses is *not* included (above) for the MDiv degree.

Concurrent Master of Divinity/Master of Arts (Theology) Program

Students accepted into a concurrent MDiv/MATH program can complete both degrees in a four-year period. Students completing all the prerequisites and requirements for the MDiv degree thereby complete the core and distribution requirements for the MATH degree (except for the Interreligious or non-Christian Religion requirement). The student must attain an overall GPA of at least 3.0, and each core course for the MATH must have a grade of "B" (3.0) or better. In addition to the those requirements, students must complete the MATH requirements, including 24 additional units (coursework + Research & Writing Credit), as indicated below.

Elective Courses. **18** units (6 courses). In consultation with their advisor, students must choose a primary area of concentration (Primary Concentration or PC) from those listed at the DSPT website, taking at least four courses in the PC (from core requirements, Complementary Curriculum, &/or electives). Exam Option students choose a Secondary Concentration (distinct from the PC), designating two courses for the MATH Capstone Exam. Normally, students may choose not more than two electives (6 units) outside theology areas; exceptions need the approval of the Academic Dean. At least two courses, preferably in the PC, must be taken at the advanced (4000) level. Courses taken to fulfill the language requirement, including courses taken to prepare a student for the GTU language exam, cannot be counted as fulfilling elective requirements. Certain advanced-level language courses designed to equip MA students for future research, however, may be counted as electives in some circumstances; students must petition the Academic Dean for approval of such coursework as electives for the degree. Students completing all MDiv requirements may use any of the units from the Complementary Curriculum to fulfill these MATH elective requirements.
