## DSPT Master of Arts (Theology), Exam Option Sequence of Courses and Fulfillment of Requirements (Typical)

The Master of Arts (Theology), Exam Option program curriculum follows a standard ordering among subdisciplines of theology, with philosophy as an allied discipline, so that there is an integration and progression of both methodologies and content over the time in the program. In general, the order is as follows: foundational philosophy, Biblical studies, church history, systematic theology, and moral theology. In each subdiscipline, the program provides a required, introductory course (or courses) to be taken early in the program, allowing for the student, through subsequent, approved electives, to undertake intermediate and advanced studies in a concentration that is found within any of these areas, as well as in one of the required areas that is different from the area of concentration, so as to provide breadth of knowledge and competence. As outlined in the sequence below, all core courses are normally completed by the time the student has earned 24 units in the program. Ordinarily, a 4000 -level course must be completed during the second semester, to ensure that the student has an opportunity: (1) to complete a RRP within the first year, and (2) to develop research skills in a timely manner.

*Electives chosen must ensure that (1) MATh requirements for the Area of Concentration for the Exam in a Required Area (the Required Area being different from the Area of Concentration) are fulfilled, (2) at least 24 units are from above the 1000 level, (3) at least 6 units are from the advanced level (numbered 4000) or above, and (4) no more than 6 units are from outside the Theology area. Normally, at least one 4000-level course is completed by the time the student has completed 24 units in the program.
